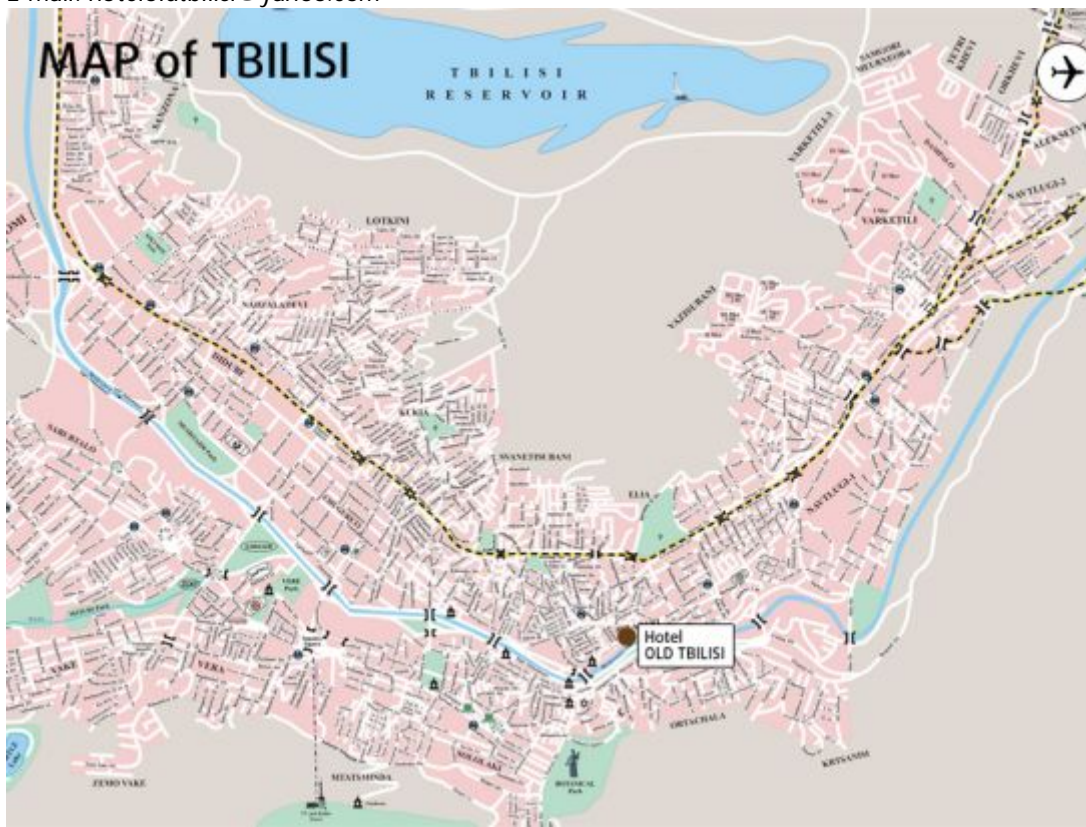

About Tbilisi

Tbilisi is the capital and largest city of Georgia. The city was founded in 5th century by the King Vakhtang Gorgasali. It has 1.5 million inhabitants and covers 350 sq.km. (135 sq.m). It is a multicultural city with more than 100 ethnicities. The majority of the population is Georgians (80%). Other 20% are Russians, Azeris, Armenians, Greeks, Germans, Ukrainians, Kurds, Estonians and others. Majority of the population belong themselves to the Georgian Orthodox Church. Other religions such as Catholic, Baptist, Lutheran, Sunni Islam, Armenian Apostolic and some other are also represented. Tbilisi is well known by its religious tolerance. The evidence of this you can find in old town where Georgian Orthodox churches, Armenian Apostolic, Jewish Synagogue and Islamic Mosque are located in one block.

The city lays on both banks of Mtkvari River, the largest river in Transcaucasia. The city is bounded by mountain ranges that make its landscape unique and beautiful. There are many places to visit and rest.

Transportation

The transportation system is well developed in Tbilisi. Yellow buses, minibuses, subway and taxis make travel easier within the city. You can travel by buses, minibuses and trains to other Georgian cities and towns. Tbilisi International Airport (TBS) is connected with major European and Asian airports.

Climate

The climate in Tbilisi is mild-continental with relatively hot summers and cold winters. Average temperature in January is 1°C (34°F), and 24°C (75°F) in July.

Architecture

The architecture in Tbilisi is mixed. There are represented Georgian, European and Eastern architecture styles. The old part of the city has a unique Georgian style with some Eastern influences while other central streets and avenues of the city are built in neoclassical European style. The mixture of architectural styles, landscape and cultural diversity make Tbilisi one of the world's most interesting and beautiful cities.
